Training Workshops

Player Profiles and Engagement

A great way of helping your participants to connect to these major events, is to follow the players and athletes. You could support your participants to research the squads and players, follow them on social media, find out where they play or compete in the club structure for that sport and open up conversations with your participants at your sessions. You may find that some of the players are from near-by, went to the local high school, or played for the club down the road. This will all help to raise the aspirations of your participants, and hopefully help them to feel proud that an international athlete is from their local community.

You could run a social media challenge with your young people, awarding points for connecting with players and athletes. Could your participants send good luck and congratulations messages to the players and squads, or photos and videos of them trying their sport within your Doorstep Sport delivery? Better still, could you empower your Young People to come up with the ideas and how to award points throughout the event?

Cultural Celebrations and Activities

A great way to connect to international events, is to celebrate and learn about different cultures. Can you theme any of your sessions based on who's taking part in the tournament or event? Have a think about how you can connect your participants to different countries through a fun sweepstake, or learning some sport related terminology in different languages perhaps. If you provide food at your sessions, how about looking at low cost snacks from different countries and trying them as a group. Don't forget to think about how to celebrate Welsh culture too! Could this be a chance to look at Welsh Language for example, or some of the history behind the songs, the logos and Wales' track record in each competition.

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




Treasure Island

- Reds v Blues
- Teams start on separate sides of the pitch with equal amount of balls in their treasure zone (we suggest 3 each)
- When players cross the half way line they can be tagged and if so they must go into oppositions jail
- Players can be freed from jail should a team mate avoid being tagged in the opponents half and high 5 the player in jail
- Only 1 ball can be stolen at a time. A player does this by getting into the treasure zone untagged and is safe once inside. This player gets free run back into their own half with the ball (put in their treasure zone)

Variations

- Increase / decrease number of balls
- Timed game rather than objective (all 6 balls).
- Pass with team mate back to their treasure zone
- Kick the ball back to team mates in the treasure zone.



StreetRugby - The Game!

Street Rugby Full Game Rules

- A pitch needs to be specified with boundaries, these can be anything from a car park, MUGA or field
- Passes may be in any direction (this can progress to backwards only when the group are ready)
- Any dropped ball or forward pass results in the other team taking possession where the ball was dropped
- A player carrying the ball may be touched below the shoulders to simulate a tackle / or taking tag from belt
- Once touched all the defending players retreat 3m from ball carrier. If ball carrier is touched within 3m try line / scoring zone defenders retreat onto try line
- Any defenders staying within the 3m zone of a touched / tackled player will result in the tackle count returning to 0 for the attacking team
- Once touched the ball carrier restarts the game by rolling the ball back between their legs
- A team mate then picks up the ball and may run or pass; once the ball is picked up the defenders can move forward and try to touch
- A point is scored by touching the ball down over the opponents try line
- When in possession of the ball a team has 6 attempts to score, after 6 touches / tackles the ball is handed over to the other team (where the sixth touch / tackle is made)
- 11. To score a try the ball must be placed down with two hands

Futsal is an exciting, fast paced, small sided football game that originates from South America. Widely played around the world, it is officially recognised by UEFA and FIFA. Lionel Messi, Christiano Ronaldo, Iniesta, Xavi, Fabregas and many others have all played Futsal to help further develop their skills.



Futsal - The Basics

- 5 a side, normally played indoors with hockey sized goals – but also perfect for a MUGA or hard court area
- A smaller, weighted size 4 ball is used
- The game is played to the lines, not the walls, using kick-ins not throw-ins
- 20 minutes per half, using a stopping clock and allowing timeouts per team
